ARTICLE I
General Provisions

§ 130-1. Definitions and interpretation.

- A. Words and phrases, when used in this chapter, except for sections or articles to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq. (the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162, No. 81), as amended, except that in this chapter the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway" and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.
- B. The term "legal holidays," as used in this chapter, shall mean and include New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
- C. In this chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

§ 130-2. Manner of adopting permanent traffic and parking regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances or as parts of ordinances or as amendments to ordinances of the Borough of Westfield.

§ 130-3. Temporary and emergency regulations.

- A. The Emergency Management Coordinator shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
 - (1) In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.
 - (2) In the case of emergency public works or public events of limited scope or duration, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
- B. These temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Emergency Management Coordinator and the police in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who drives or parks a vehicle in violation of any such regulation or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature.

§ 130-4. Experimental regulations.

- A. The Borough Council may from time to time designate places upon and along the streets in the Borough where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect and shall designate those locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective just as if they had been specified in this chapter. No person shall drive or park a vehicle in violation of any such regulation, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this section. Any person who violates any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, be liable to the penalty set out in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature.
- B. The purpose of this section is to allow for test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Borough relative to traffic and parking.

§ 130-5. Streets closed or restricted for construction, maintenance or special events.

- A. The Borough Council shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion, while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.
- B. The Borough Council shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagpersons at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagperson is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.

§ 130-6. Authority of police officers.

The police shall have authority to direct traffic on the streets in the Borough, at intersections in public and in other places where the Vehicle Code or this chapter applies.

ARTICLE II
Traffic Regulations

§ 130-7. Speed limits.

The speed limit for both directions of traffic along the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule I (§ 130-48), attached to and made a part of this chapter, is hereby established at the rate of speed indicated in said schedule. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that street or part of a street.

§ 130-8. Traffic control signals.

Traffic control signals shall be installed and operated at the intersections of those streets described in Schedule II (§ 130-49), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 130-9. Prohibited right turns on red signal.

No person shall make a right turn (or a left turn from a one-way street into another one-way street) when facing a steady red signal at any of the locations described in Schedule III (§ 130-50), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 130-10. Prohibited turns at intersections.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to make a turn of the kind designated (left, right, all) at any of the intersections described in Schedule IV (§ 130-51), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 130-11. U-turns.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to make a U-turn on any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule V (§ 130-52), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 130-12. One-way streets.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VI (§ 130-53), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any one-way street other than in the direction established for traffic on that street.

§ 130-13. No-passing zones.

No-passing zones are hereby established along those streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VII (§ 130-54), attached to and made a part of this chapter, and it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to overtake or pass another vehicle or to drive on the left side of the roadway in any no-passing zone described in said schedule.

§ 130-14. Through streets.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VIII (§ 130-55), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby established as through streets; and the driver of any vehicle, upon approaching any such street at any intersection thereof (except for such intersections where there are now or shall hereafter be located official traffic signals), shall come to a full stop or yield the right-of-way, as the case may be, before entering any such through street.

§ 130-15. Stop intersections.

The intersections described in Schedule IX (§ 130-56), attached to and made a part of this chapter (in addition to intersections with the through streets established by this chapter), are hereby established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected in such a position upon the first-named street as to face traffic approaching the second-named street in the direction or directions indicated in said schedule. Every driver of a vehicle approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, shall come to a full stop before entering any such intersection.

§ 130-16. Yield intersections.

The intersections described in Schedule X (§ 130-57), attached to and made a part of this chapter (in addition to intersections with the through streets established by this chapter), are hereby established as yield intersections, and official yield signs shall be erected in such a position upon the first-named street as to face traffic approaching the second-named street in the direction or directions indicated. Every driver of a vehicle approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, shall slow down or stop the vehicle and then yield the right-of-way to any vehicle in the intersection or approaching on the second-named street so closely as to constitute a hazard during the time that the driver is moving across or within such intersection.

§ 130-17. Vehicle weight limits.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive any commercial vehicle or other tractor, trailer or tractor-trailer combination, having a gross weight in excess of that respectively prescribed, upon any of the streets or bridges or portions thereof described in Schedule XI (§ 130-58), attached to and made a part of this chapter, except for the purpose of making local deliveries on said streets.

ARTICLE III Parking Regulations

§ 130-18. Vehicles to be parked within marked spaces.

Wherever a space is marked off on any street for the parking of an individual vehicle, every vehicle parked there shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding that space, and it shall be a violation of this article for any person to park a vehicle or allow it to remain parked otherwise.

§ 130-19. Parking prohibited at all times.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule XIII (§ 130-59), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 130-20. Winter parking prohibited.

No person shall, between November 1 of each year and April 15 of the following year, park a vehicle during the hours specified in said schedule upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule XIV (§ 130-60), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 130-21. Two-hour parking limit. [Added 10-9-2013 by Ord. No. 319]

Parking shall be limited to two hours on the following streets:

West Main Street	Both	From Church Street west to Iron Bridge

§ 130-22. Special purpose parking zones.

Special purpose parking zones will be designated by permit only. Permit applications will be available in the Westfield Borough Office. A fee as set by resolution of the Borough Council¹ may be charged for any person seeking a special purpose parking permit.

§ 130-23. Penalties for parking violations. [Amended 2-9-2011 by Ord. No. 312]

- A. Any person who violates any provision of this article shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15 and costs. The notice shall contain instructions to the owner or driver of the vehicle on the terms and amount of payment.
- B. An expired meter violation is \$5 if paid within 48 hours, \$10 if paid after 48 hours. A ten-dollar fine will be imposed for all other parking violations.

**ARTICLE IV
Parking Meter Zones**

§ 130-24. Definitions.

For the purposes of this article, the following words, when used, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except in those instances where the context clearly indicates otherwise:

OPERATOR — Includes every individual who shall operate a motor vehicle as the owner thereof or as the agent, employee or permittee of the owners or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.

PERSON — Includes every natural person, firm, copartnership, association or corporation.

STREET — Any public street, avenue, road, highway, place, court or other public place located in the Borough of Westfield and established for the use of vehicles.

VEHICLE — Any device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported upon a highway, except a device which is operated upon rails or tracks.

§ 130-25. Authorization.

The proper officers of the Borough of Westfield are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract, in accordance with law, for the leasing and installing of parking meters, the payment for said meters and installation to be provided for solely from the receipts, funds and revenues obtained by the Borough from the operation of said parking meters without in any manner obligating the Borough to pay for the same from any other source.

§ 130-26. Parking meter zones established. [Amended 12-14-2005 by Ord. No. 299]

Parking meters shall be installed, operated, maintained, policed and supervised on the restricted streets and public places listed in Schedule XVIII (§ 130-62), attached to and made a part of this chapter, which said streets are described and designated as parking meter zones to provide parking spaces upon the payment of a proper coin or coins of the United States as herein designated:

- A. Period of 1/2 hour: \$0.10.
- B. Period of two hours: \$0.25.

§ 130-27. Placement of meters.

Parking meters installed in the parking meter zones as established under the provisions of § 130-26 of this article shall be placed upon the sidewalk immediately adjacent to the individual parking places hereinafter described. Each parking meter shall be placed or set in such manner as to show that the parking space adjacent to such meter is or is not legally occupied. Each parking meter installed shall indicate by a proper legend the legal parking time established by the Borough and, when operated, shall indicate by its violation signal, dial or pointer illegal parking.

§ 130-28. Manner of parking.

Where lines or markings are painted or placed upon the curb, sidewalk and/or upon the streets adjacent to each parking meter for the purpose of designating the parking space for which said meter is to be used, every vehicle parked adjacent or next to any parking meter shall park within the lines or markings so placed. It shall be a violation of the provisions of this article to park any vehicle of a lesser overall length than the designated area in such a position that the same shall not be completed within the space provided for one vehicle.

§ 130-29. Deposit of coins.

When any vehicle shall be parked in any space adjacent to which a parking meter is located in accordance with the provisions of this article, the operator shall, upon entering said parking space, immediately deposit or cause to be deposited a proper coin or proper coins of the United States of America in such parking meter and in a manually operated parking meter turn the handle. Failure to deposit such coin or coins and turn such handle shall constitute a breach of this article and shall subject such person to the penalty prescribed in § 130-34 hereof. Upon the deposit of such coin or coins and placing said meter in operation, the parking space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle during the period of parking time prescribed for the part of the street in which said parking space is located as indicated on the parking meter. If said vehicle shall remain parked in any such parking space beyond the parking time limit fixed for such parking space, the parking meter shall, by its violation signal, dial or pointer, indicate such illegal parking; in that event, such vehicle shall be considered as parking overtime or beyond the period of legal parking time in any such part of a street where any such parking meter is located and shall be a violation of this article and punishable as hereinafter set forth.

§ 130-30. Overtime parking prohibited.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this article for any person to cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in the name of or operated by such persons to be parked after the meter has expired or beyond the period of legal parking time from Monday through Friday, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. in any metered parking zone.

§ 130-31. Deposit of slugs prohibited.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this article to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter any slug, device or other substitute for a proper coin or coins of the United States of America.²

§ 130-32. Impairment of meters prohibited; exception.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this article for any person to deface, injure, tamper with, break, destroy, impair the usefulness of or open any parking meter installed under the provisions of this article, it being understood that nothing contained in this section shall in any way interfere with the duties of the properly authorized agent of the Borough to open the meters in the discharge of his or her duties.³

§ 130-34. Violations and penalties.

Any person, firm, corporation, association or organization, whether as principal or agent, violating or assisting in the violation of any of the provisions of this article shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding \$150 and cost of prosecution and, in default of the payment of such fine and costs of prosecution, shall be confined to the Tioga County Jail for a period not exceeding 10 days.⁴

§ 130-35. (Reserved)**ARTICLE V****Removal and Impounding of Certain Vehicles****§ 130-36. Applicability and scope.**

This article is enacted under authority of Section 6109(a)(22) of the Vehicle Code⁵ and gives authority to the Borough to remove and impound vehicles that are parked in violation of any provision of this chapter.

§ 130-37. Authority to remove and impound.

The Borough shall have authority to remove and impound or to order the removal and impounding of any vehicle parked overtime or otherwise illegally, provided that the circumstances of its parking were within the conditions stated in § 130-36 of this article, and provided that no such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this article.

§ 130-38. Designation of approved storage garages; bonding; towing and storage.

Removal and impounding of vehicles under this article shall be done only by approved storage garages that shall be designated from time to time by the Borough Council. Every such garage shall submit evidence to the Borough Council that it is bonded or has acquired liability insurance in an amount satisfactory to the Borough Council as sufficient to indemnify owners of impounded vehicles against loss or damage to those vehicles while in the custody of the garagekeeper for the purpose of towing or storage. The approved storage garage shall submit to the Borough Council its schedule of charges for towing and storage of vehicles under this article, and when the schedule is approved by the Borough Council, those charges shall be adhered to by the approved storage garage. No different schedule of charges shall be adopted without approval of the Borough Council, and no different charges shall be demanded of or collected from any person whose vehicle is removed or impounded under this article by any approved storage garage. The Borough Council shall delete from its list of approved storage garages any garage that makes any unapproved charge in connection with any vehicle removed or impounded under this article.

§ 130-39. Notification of removal and impounding.

Within 12 hours from the time of removal of any vehicle under authority granted by this article, notice of the fact that the vehicle was removed shall be sent by the Borough to the owner of record of the vehicle. The notice shall designate the place from which the vehicle was removed, the reason for its removal and impounding and the garage in which it was impounded.

§ 130-40. Effect of payment of towing and storage charges.

The payment of any towing and storage charges authorized by this article shall, unless payment is made under protest, be final and conclusive and shall constitute a waiver of any right to recover the money so paid. If payment of any towing or storage charges is made under protest, the offender shall be entitled to a hearing before a District Justice. Payment of towing and storage charges shall not relieve the owner or driver of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of the provision of this chapter for which the vehicle was removed or impounded.

§ 130-41. Records of vehicles removed and impounded.

The Borough shall cause a record to be kept of all vehicles impounded under this article and shall be able at all reasonable times to furnish the owners or the agents of the owners of those vehicles with information as to the place of storage of the vehicle.

§ 130-42. Restrictions upon removal of vehicles.

No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this article if, at the time of the intended removal, the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove the vehicle immediately.

ARTICLE VI**Snow and Ice Emergencies****§ 130-43. Declaration of snow and ice emergency.**

In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the snow emergency routes named pursuant to this article, the Mayor and/or Emergency Management Coordinator, in his or her discretion, may declare a snow and ice emergency (designated in this article as a "snow emergency"). Information on the existence of a snow emergency may be given by the Borough through radio, newspaper or other available media, and information on the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.

§ 130-44. Parking and driving restrictions.

After any snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful, at any time during the continuance of the emergency, for any person:

- A. To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route designated pursuant to this article; or
- B. To drive any motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route unless that vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains.

§ 130-45. Snow emergency routes.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XIX (§ 130-63), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as snow emergency routes.

§ 130-46. Penalty for violation.

- A. If at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under this article a person shall park a motor vehicle or allow a motor vehicle to remain parked anywhere upon a snow emergency route, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this article and, upon conviction, shall be punishable as provided in § 130-23 of this chapter.
- B. If at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under this article a person shall drive a motor vehicle upon a snow emergency route without having that vehicle equipped with snow tires or chains, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this article and, upon conviction, shall be punishable as provided in § 130-23 of this chapter.

ARTICLE VII**Miscellaneous Provisions****§ 130-47. Violations and penalties.**

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq.) or except as herein specified, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this chapter or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a penalty of \$50 and costs of prosecution.

ARTICLE IX

Weight and Size Limitation and Bonding
[Added 7-13-2011 by Ord. No. 313]**§ 130-65. Short title.**

This article shall be known as the "Motor Vehicle Weight and Size Limitation and Bonding Ordinance of Westfield Borough."

§ 130-66. Enactment.

This article is enacted pursuant to the authority conferred by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, including the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, Act of June 17, 1976, No. 81, Section 1, et seq., as amended and supplemented, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101, et seq. This article is intended to include and be subject to all provisions of § 4902 of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, including by way of illustration and not limitation, § 49023(a) and (b) and § 6103, and all Pennsylvania Department of Transportation regulations promulgated thereunder.

§ 130-67. Definitions.

The following words when used in this article shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

EMERGENCY VEHICLE — A fire department vehicle; police vehicle; ambulance; blood delivery vehicle; Armed Forces emergency vehicle; one private vehicle of a fire or police chief or assistant chief, or ambulance corps commander or assistant commander, or of a river rescue commander used for answering emergency calls; or other vehicle designated by the Pennsylvania State Police under § 6101 of the Vehicle Code (relating to designation of emergency vehicles by Pennsylvania State Police).

LOCAL TRAFFIC — Emergency vehicles and school buses as defined hereinafter, vehicles and combinations or governmental entities and utilities where their contractors are engaged in construction or maintenance on a posted highway or in a location which can be reached only via a posted highway, and vehicles and combinations going to or from a residence or farm located on a posted highway or which can be reached only via a posted highway.

MOTOR VEHICLE — Any vehicle or combination as defined and/or governed by the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A. § 102), as amended.

POSTED BRIDGE — Any Borough bridge posted with a weight or size limitation or restriction imposed under the authority of this article.

POSTED ROAD — Any Borough road posted with a weight or size limitation or restriction imposed under the authority of this article.

SCHOOL BUS — A motor vehicle designated for carrying more than 10 passengers, exclusive of the driver, and used for the transportation of school children.

VEHICLE CODE — The Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, Act of June 17, 1976, No. 81, Section 1, et seq., as amended and supplemented, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101, et seq.

§ 130-68. Section 4902(a): Findings of the Borough Council of Westfield Borough.

Pursuant to the provisions of § 4902(a) of the Vehicle Code, the Borough Council has determined and hereby determines, based upon engineering and traffic studies, that the following road and bridges will be damaged or destroyed unless the permissible size or weight, or both, of motor vehicles is restricted to the size and weight limits listed. A complete list of the roads and bridges, identified by their route number, road or bridge name, part of the road restricted and size and weight limit, is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and is made a part hereof.⁶ This list may be modified, amended or enlarged from time to time by the Borough Council by duly adopted resolution.

§ 130-69. Vehicle weight and size limits established.

Pursuant to the findings made under § 130-68 hereof, and by the authority of § 4902(a) of the Vehicle Code and regulations promulgated thereunder, no motor vehicle or combination shall be operated upon any posted road or posted bridge with a gross weight or a size in excess of the weight and size limits listed for said road or bridge in § 130-68 hereof.

§ 130-70. Section 4902(b): Findings of the Borough Council of Westfield Borough.

Pursuant to the provisions of § 4902(b) of the Vehicle Code, the Borough Council has determined and hereby determines, based upon hazardous traffic conditions or other safety factors, that the use of the following roads and bridges by vehicles exceeding a certain weight or size, or both, will endanger the public or users of said roads and bridges unless the permissible weight or size, or both, of motor vehicles is restricted to the size and weight limits listed. A complete list of the roads and bridges, identified by their route number, road or bridge name, part of the road restricted and size limit and weight limit, is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and is made a part hereof.⁷ This list may be modified, amended or enlarged from time to time by the Borough Council by duly adopted resolution.

§ 130-71. Section 4902(b): Vehicle weight and size limits established.

Pursuant to the findings made under § 130-70 hereof, and by the authority of § 4902(b) of the Vehicle Code and regulations promulgated thereunder, no motor vehicle or combination shall be operated upon any posted road or posted bridge with a gross weight or of a size in excess of the size and weight limits listed for said road or bridge in § 130-70 hereof.

§ 130-72. Exemptions.

Local traffic, as defined herein, shall be exempted from the restrictions imposed under §§ 130-68 and 130-70 hereof. However, if the Borough Council determines that any local traffic is likely to damage a posted road or bridge, the Borough Council will so notify the registrants of the motor vehicle or combination and will also notify the Westfield Borough Police Department. After two business days following delivery of the notice, or after five

days following mailing of the notice, such traffic vehicles shall not exceed the posted weight and size limits except in accordance with § 130-73 hereof.

§ 130-73. Permits and security.

- A. Individuals or entities wishing to operate vehicles in excess of established weight and size limits on a posted road or bridge must apply for a permit to do so on a form provided by the Borough. Fees shall be set by resolution. Upon payment of an administrative fee, the application will be referred to the Council President or his designee who shall:
- (1) Issue a temporary permit (if applicable), place the issue on the agenda for the next regular meeting of the Borough Council;
 - (2) Consult with the third-party consultant as necessary to determine the amount and type of security or bond to be posted by the applicant. The amount of security or bond shall be calculated in accordance with Title 67, Chapter 189, of the Pennsylvania Code or its equivalent; and
 - (3) Present a recommendation to the Council to include the amount of security or bond to be posted by the applicant if the permit is approved.
- B. No permit will be issued until and unless the application is approved by the Borough Council, the required security or bond has been posted with the Borough Secretary, and all administrative, inspection and third-party consultation fees have been paid in full. The Borough Council shall, by resolution, set the amount of administrative, inspection and third-party consultation fees, and may delegate the authority to approve permits and set security to the Council President or other official of the Borough.
- C. All actions taken under the authority of this section shall be taken in accordance with the rules and regulations adopted by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation, as found in Title 67 of the Pennsylvania Code.

§ 130-74. Erection of signs.

The Borough shall erect or cause to be erected and maintained restriction signs designating the weight and size restrictions at each end of the portion of road restricted, or the road providing access to the restricted bridge, as provided in this article. In the case of a restriction on a road which has not begun or ended at an intersection with an unrestricted highway, or a restriction on a bridge accessed by such a road, the Borough shall also place an advance informational sign at the intersection nearest each end of the restricted portion of the road which would allow drivers to avoid the restricted portion of the road or the restricted bridge.

§ 130-75. Penalties.

- A. Any person operating a motor vehicle or combination upon a road or bridge in violation of a prohibition or restriction imposed under § 130-68 hereof shall, upon conviction, pay a fine in the maximum amount allowed by § 4902(g)(1) of the Vehicle Code, as amended and supplemented, or by any equivalent section of the Vehicle Code, or the

maximum amount allowed by law, plus court costs, legal fees and other expenses incurred by the Borough in enforcing this article.

- B. Any person operating a motor vehicle or combination upon a road or bridge in violation of a prohibition or restriction imposed under § 130-70 hereof shall, upon conviction, pay a fine in the maximum amount allowed by § 4902(g)(2) of the Vehicle Code, as amended and supplemented, or by any equivalent section of the Vehicle Code, or the maximum allowed by law, plus court costs, legal fees and other expenses incurred by the Borough in enforcing this article.

§ 130-76. Repealer.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with any of the provisions of this article are hereby repealed insofar as the same conflicts with this article.

§ 130-77. Severability.

The provisions of this article are severable and if any of its sections, clauses or sentences shall be held unlawful, invalid or unconstitutional, such provisions shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions of this article.

§ 130-78. Effective date.

This article shall become effective immediately after its final passage and adoption the Borough Council of Westfield Borough.
